Inside Seventh Heaven is a southwest style clubhouse that features a full service restaurant, banquet facilities and a well-placed golf shop. The golf shop prides itself in carrying the latest accessories and equipment, as well as the finest apparel for men and women. The Seventh Heaven staff is always available to provide their customers with custom golf club fittings.

The latest addition to the city's series of excellent golf courses is The Falls, situated at Lake Las Vegas. The course, designed by Tom Weiskopf, offers a terrain of marvelous mountain and desert, with spectacular landscapes. The cascading man-made waterfall perfectly completes this fabulous golf course.

Professional and amateur golfers alike can enjoy the beauty and challenge of all of these Las Vegas golf courses.
